and Dhanbad in the west, Dumka district in the North-West Bengal state boundary in the South and East. Its population is about 7.9 lakh and the state's 6th least populated district. Gender distribution in the district, male about 4 lakhs (51%), and about 3.9 lakhs (49%) are female. The major population nearly 90% (about 7.2 lakhs) lives in rural areas, and the rest of them lived in urban areas (District profile, Jharkhand, 2022). That's the reason the lowest literacy rate is about 65% percent as per the census 2011, The Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act (RTE) reflects the determination and resolve of the government to entitle every child to elementary education, but order for this to translate into reality recognizing and addressing challenges becomes as a priority, from the high pupil-teacher ratios, the insignificant improvements in retention at school for many students to the challenges for the quality of education and filling the gaps in teaching personal (Rustagi P. and Menon R., 2013) due to low literacy, and poverty Jamtara become human trafficking hub (Verma, D. N.; 2014), and fewer crimes against human compare to other states of Jharkhand (Firoz A., Md.M.U, Laxmi G., 2018), but the young people involving in financial-related frauds, that's why these districts i.e. Jamtara of Jharkhand and Noida in Uttar Pradesh, became hubs of financial frauds by making fake calls imitating bank officials to cheat gullible customers in order to withdraw money from their accounts by setting call centers and off-center i.e. their respective village (Balsing Rajpoot, 2020). According to a news portal, a twenty-year-old man was arrested from Jamtara, who had allegedly hired around 30 local youths to run rackets that called up people and duped them by convincing them to share their banking details (telegraph, 31/03/2022).
